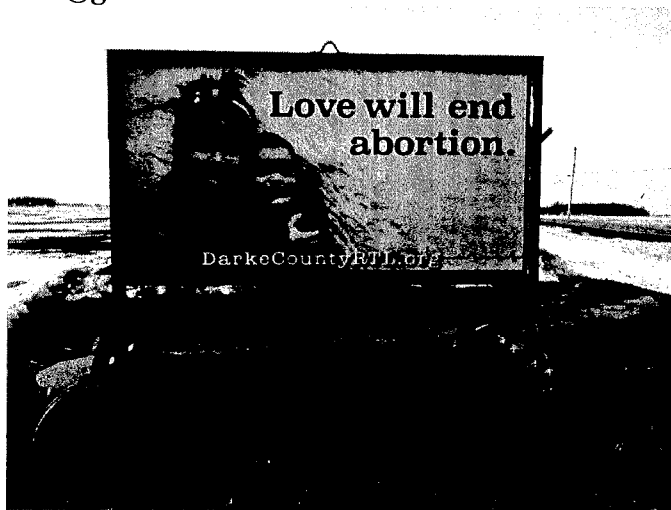

Have you heard the term called Fetal-Microchimerism. I find this fascinating. An article by Laura Grace Weldon called [Mother & Child Are Linked At The Cellular Level](#) helped to explain the process.

It's now known that cells from a developing fetus cross the placenta, allowing the baby's DNA to become part of the mother's body. These fetal cells persist in a woman's body into her old age. This is true even if the baby she carried didn't live to be born. The cells of that child stay with her, resonating in ways that mothers have known intuitively throughout time.

Fetal cells you contributed to your own mother may be found in her blood, bone marrow, skin, kidney, and liver. These fetal cells appear to "treat" her when she is ill or injured. Researchers have noticed the presence of these cells in women diagnosed with illnesses such as thyroid disease and hepatitis C. In one case, a woman stopped treatment against medical advice. A liver biopsy showed "thousands of male cells"

determined to be from a pregnancy terminated nearly 20 years earlier.

Any woman who has ever been pregnant, even if she miscarried so early she never knew she was with child, is likely to be a microchimera (a person who carries the cells of another person). Fetal cells have the imprint of her child's father and his ancestry. Fetal cells can be shared from one pregnancy to another, meaning the cells of older siblings may float within younger siblings. These cells are another reminder of the ways we are connected in a holographic universe.

Overall, the presence of fetal cells in a woman's body is associated with substantially improved longevity, with an overall mortality rate 60 percent lower than women whose bodies don't contain such cells.

Children heal their mother whether the child was miscarried, aborted, or born. How awesome is this when you think about it!

## DISMEMBERED FETAL REMAINS FOUND IN TRASH AT NORTHEAST OHIO ABORTION FACILITY

COLUMBUS, Ohio-- July 7<sup>th</sup>, Ohio Right to Life announced that the dismembered remains of an unborn baby had been found thrown away behind an abortion facility in northeast Ohio. The remains, which appear to be from an unborn child approximately 17 weeks' gestation, were found discarded in a dumpster along with numerous other items of interest.

Governor Mike DeWine signed S.B. 27, the Unborn Child Dignity Act, into law in December 2020. S.B. 27 requires the Ohio Department of Health to establish rules for the proper and humane burial or cremation of children who have lost their lives to an abortion procedure.

The Unborn Child Dignity Act was first introduced after then-Attorney General DeWine discovered that Planned Parenthood had dumped the bodies of abortion victims in a Kentucky landfill. In March 2021, Planned Parenthood, along with the

ACLU, filed a lawsuit to stop the law from going into effect. After a judge issued a preliminary injunction against S.B. 27 in April 2021, Governor DeWine signed an executive order regarding the emergency adoption of the law's required rules by the Ohio Department of Health.

### **Second Hearing Held for the Born-Alive Infant Protection Act**

S.B. 157, the Born-Alive Infant Protection Act had its second hearing in the Ohio Senate Government Oversight and Reform Committee. This vital piece of anti-infanticide legislation would require a report to be created by the Ohio Department of Health for the abortionist to file if a baby is born alive during a botched abortion. It would also require that the doctors perform life-saving treatment to the baby, as they would to an infant born alive in any other situation.

Ohio Right to Life's Director of Communications, Allie Frazier testified on behalf of the bill, stating, "The issue isn't whether or not those children, born prematurely or with a fatal diagnosis, will ultimately survive. The issue is us being able to decide who gets left alone to die and who does not."

Currently, Ohio law only allows abortions at and beyond 20 weeks if the child is deemed "unviable" or if a mother's life or a serious bodily function is at risk. However, the lives of 95 unborn children ended at

20 weeks or later in Ohio in 2019. Due to the state's lack of reporting requirements and safeguards, it is unknown if any of those children were born alive after the initial attempt to end their lives and if they were afforded the same level of potentially life-saving care

### **Requirements Strengthened for Abortion Facilities' Back-Up Physicians**

Ohio's biennial budget bill would strengthen current requirements for doctors who are listed on abortion facilities' variances. Thanks to Senator Steve Huffman, who introduced a pro-life amendment to H.B. 6, doctors listed as back-up physicians for Ohio abortion facilities must have admitting privileges at a local hospital within a twenty-five mile radius of the facility and actively practice clinical medicine within a twenty-five mile radius of the facility, among other requirements.

Currently, all ambulatory surgical facilities in Ohio must have either a transfer agreement with a local hospital or have multiple doctors listed as back-up physicians to receive a variance.

### **New Budget Amendment Aimed at Planned Parenthood's Sex Ed**

A new amendment in H.B. 6, Ohio's biennial budget bill, would encourage healthy relationships and improve informed consent for parents. The amendment ensures that Ohio's current laws, which encourage abstinence and adoption, are respected by notifying parents when any sex education curriculum not in line with Ohio values is taught in our public schools.

This measure will help protect and inform students and their parents when organizations like Planned Parenthood teach at their local schools. Planned Parenthood, whose explicit sex education normalizes abortion and elevates risky behavior in teens, committed 354,871 abortions during the 2019-2020 fiscal year.

Ensuring that parents have control and information regarding the teaching of critical subjects such as sex education is vital to protecting the family.

## **FAUCI FUNDED RESEARCH WITH BODY PARTS FROM VIABLE, HEALTHY BABIES KILLED IN ABORTIONS**

Anthony Fauci's agency is using American tax dollars to fund unethical experiments with body parts from potentially viable, healthy aborted babies.

Fauci, Joe Biden's chief medical officer, also leads the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases.

A new investigation by the Daily Wire found that Fauci's agency supported a study at the University of California-San Francisco that used organs from 18 to 23 week aborted babies to study bacterial growth.

The study "Viable bacterial colonization is highly limited in the human intestine in utero" was published in February 2020 in the journal "Nature Medicine."

According to the study, researchers used "donated" intestine, kidneys, spleens and lymph nodes from aborted babies at 18 to 23 weeks gestation. The babies' organs came from the Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology and Reproductive Science at Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital, the study noted.

The babies' organs "were collected by a single operator using sterile tools within 10 minutes of termination procedure and placed into sterile containers" and then "transported in media on ice and processed within 2 hours after collection," according to the study.

The researchers acknowledged several sources of taxpayer funding that they used to conduct their study, including a National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases grant from which the university used \$113,727 since 2017 (Grant No. F31 AI136336), the Daily Wire reports. Other taxpayer-funded grants came from the National Science Foundation and National Institutes of Health.

The group that initially discovered the study, Pro-Life San Francisco, has been urging UCSF to stop its unethical abortion and research practices, according to the report.

Earlier this week, Pro-Life San Francisco released documents it received from the university through a public documents request showing how UCSF is harvesting aborted babies' genitalia and other organs for research.

Unbeknownst to most Americans, their tax dollars are funding these disturbing, unethical abortion practices.

Earlier this summer, David Daleiden, founder of the Center for Medical Progress, told Townhall that Fauci's agency also gave \$61 million to the University of Pittsburgh in 2019 for scientific research, and some of that money funded grisly experiments involving aborted baby body parts being attached to mice and rats.

In one study, scientists used scalps from aborted babies between 18 and 20 weeks of pregnancy to create "humanized" mice and rats to study the human immune system. The researchers described it as "full-thickness human skin."

Along with their article, the researchers published photos of their experiment – horrific images that show tufts of babies' hair growing on the rodents.

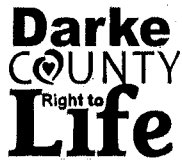
Under the Obama administration, at least \$77 million tax dollars were spent on research projects that used aborted baby body parts, according to The Hill. The Trump administration cut off funding to the unethical research and created a new ethical advisory board to prevent further funding. However, the Biden administration quickly reversed the actions earlier this year.

### **LEGISLATION**

**"No Taxpayer Funding for Abortion Act" – H. R. 18** – is currently in the U. S. House. It would codify the Hyde Amendment and apply to all government spending. Hyde has saved 2 ½ million lives since its inclusion in appropriation bills since 1976. (NRL News 7/1/21)

**"Women's Health Protection Act"** - was introduced in the U. S. Congress June 8<sup>th</sup>. The sweeping legislation seeks to enshrine abortion-on-demand into federal law and requires taxpayer funding. The Senate Judiciary Committee heard testimony 6/16/21. (INRL News)  
**The Dickey-Wicker Amendment of 1996** - prohibits the use of federal funds for creating, destroying or injuring human embryos in research. Regardless, NIH will do fetal research & funding is available too. Dickey-Wicker like Hyde are attachments to appropriations, not law.

**Extreme Cabinet Appointments** – Tracy-Stone Manning will head the Bureau of Land Management. She is a radical that favors population control and considers a baby an "environmental hazard". (Life News.com 6/29/21)
